I, Richard Pappé, a naturalized and loyal citizen of the United States, do hereby apply to the Legation of the United States at Berlin for a passport for myself and wife, and my minor children as follows: Albert born at Wolowau Kansas on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of July, 1883, and Richard, born at Prall, Kansas, 20<sup>th</sup> day of June 1887.

In support of the above application, I do solemnly swear that I was born at Stottinbeck of Sopark, Prussia on or about the 5<sup>th</sup> day of December, 1860; that I emigrated to the United States, sailing on board the Peter de Bromick, from Hamburg, the 11<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1882, and arriving at New York the 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, 1882; that I resided five years uninterruptedly in the United States, from April 1882 to Sept. 1888 at Prall Kansas; that I was naturalized as a citizen of the United States before the District Court of Reus County Kansas, at Hickinson, on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1888, as shown by the accompanying certificate of naturalization: that I am the holder of Passport No. \_\_\_\_\_ issued by \_\_\_\_\_ on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 18\_\_\_\_, which is returned herewith, that I am the identical person referred to in said certificate and passport; that I am domiciled in the United States, my permanent residence therein being at Prall, in the State of Kansas, where I follow the occupation of a farmer; that I last left the United States on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of September, 1888, on board the Shuria, arriving in Liverpool the 9<sup>th</sup> day of September, 1888; that I have resided in Leipzig since the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November, 1888; that I am now temporarily residing at Leipzig; and that I intend to return to the United States 27<sup>th</sup> day of Feb. 1889 with a purpose of residing and performing the duties of citizenship there.
